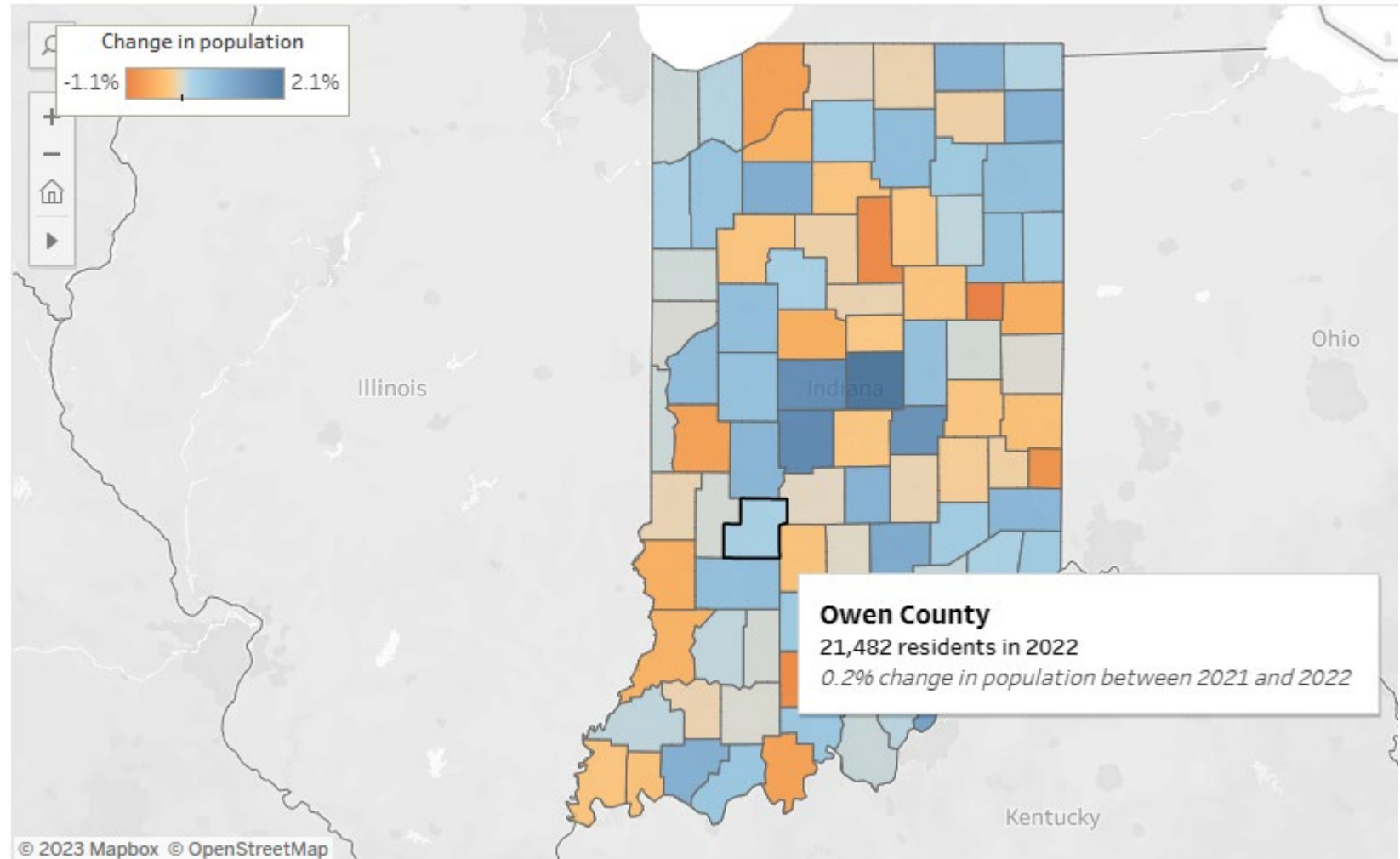


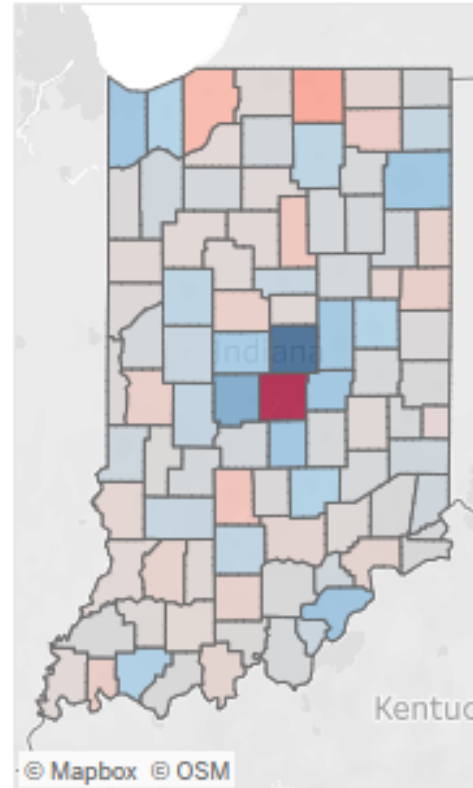

Percent change in population, 2021-2022

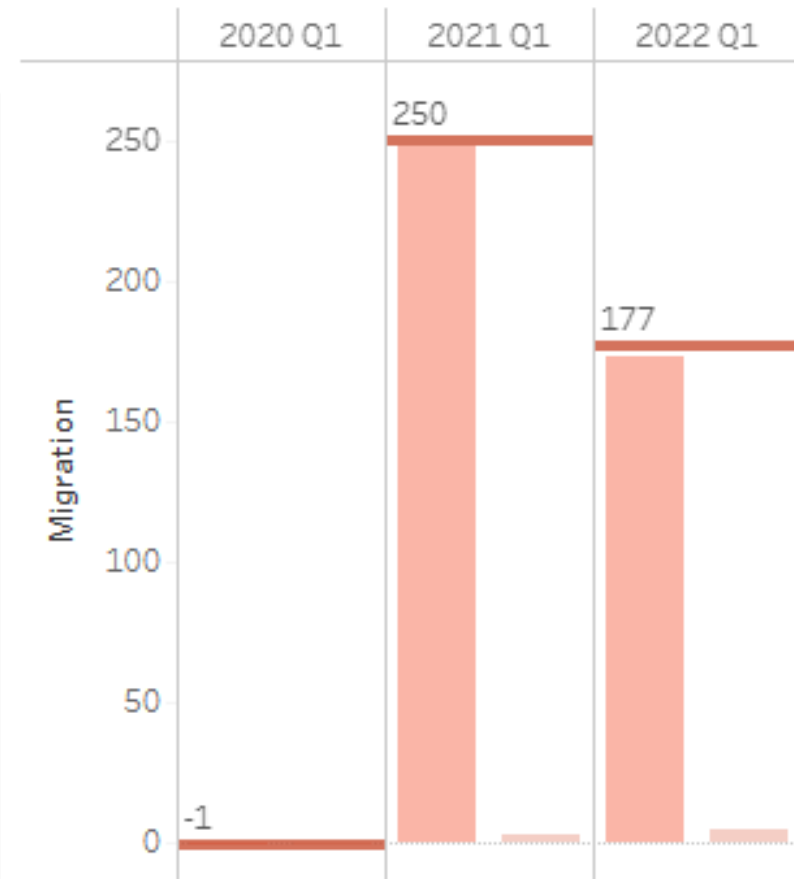

2022



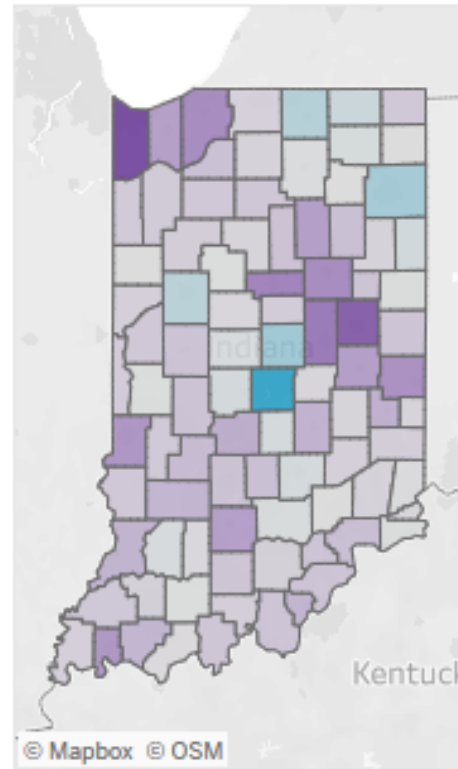

## CHILDREN IN FOSTER CARE



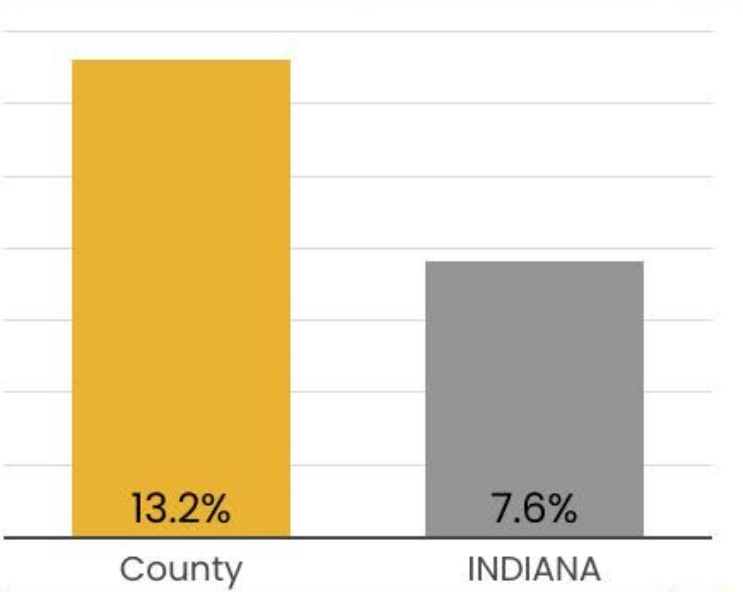

# Social Vulnerability Index

**DEFINITION:** Social vulnerability refers to potential negative effects on communities caused by external stresses on human health. Such stresses include natural or human-caused disasters, or disease outbreaks. SVI is comprised of 16 social factors, grouped into four related themes.

## Socioeconomic Status Theme

- below 150% poverty, unemployed, housing cost burden, no high school diploma, no health insurance

## Household Characteristics Theme

- aged 65 or older, aged 17 or younger, civilian with a disability, single-parent households, English language proficiency

## Racial & Ethnic Minority Status Theme

- Hispanic or Latino; Black; American Indian and Alaska Native; Asian; Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander; Two or More Races

## Housing Type & Transportation Theme

- multi-unit structures, mobile homes, crowding, no vehicle, group quarters

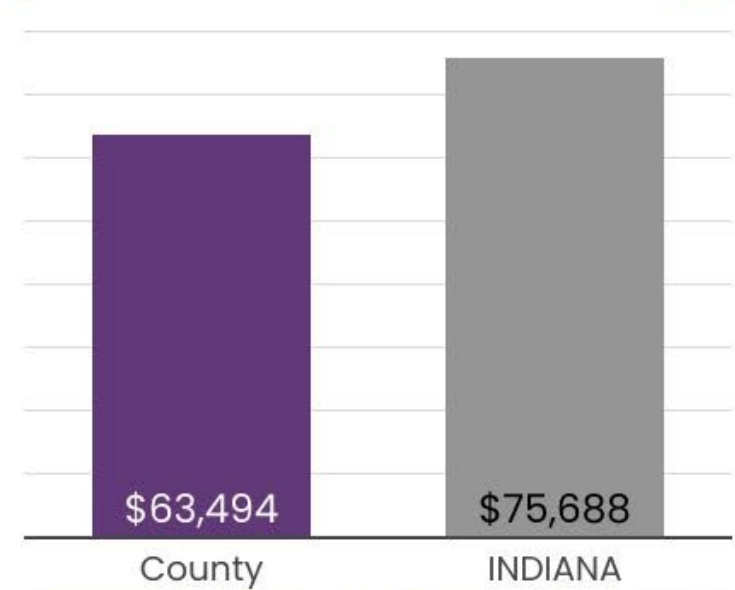

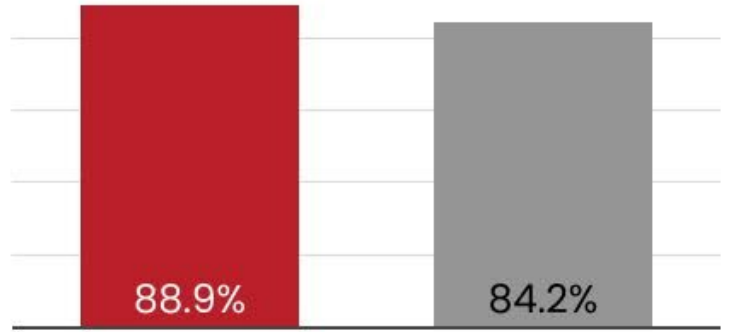

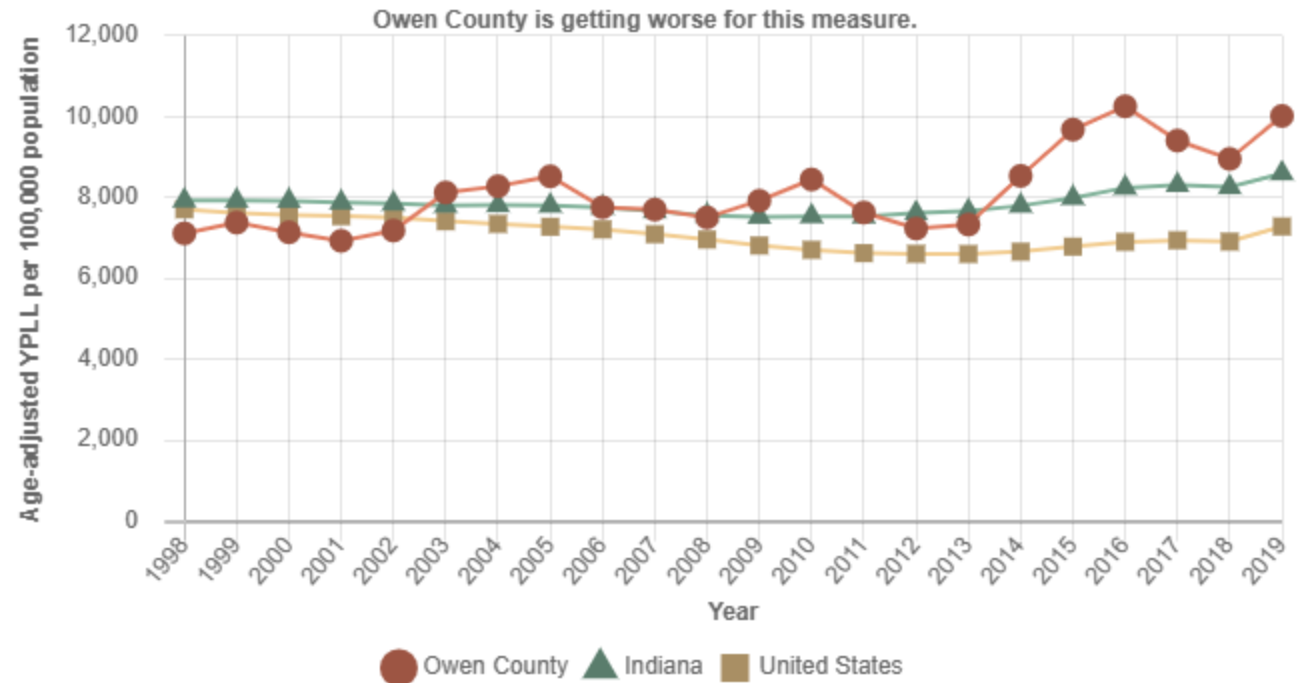

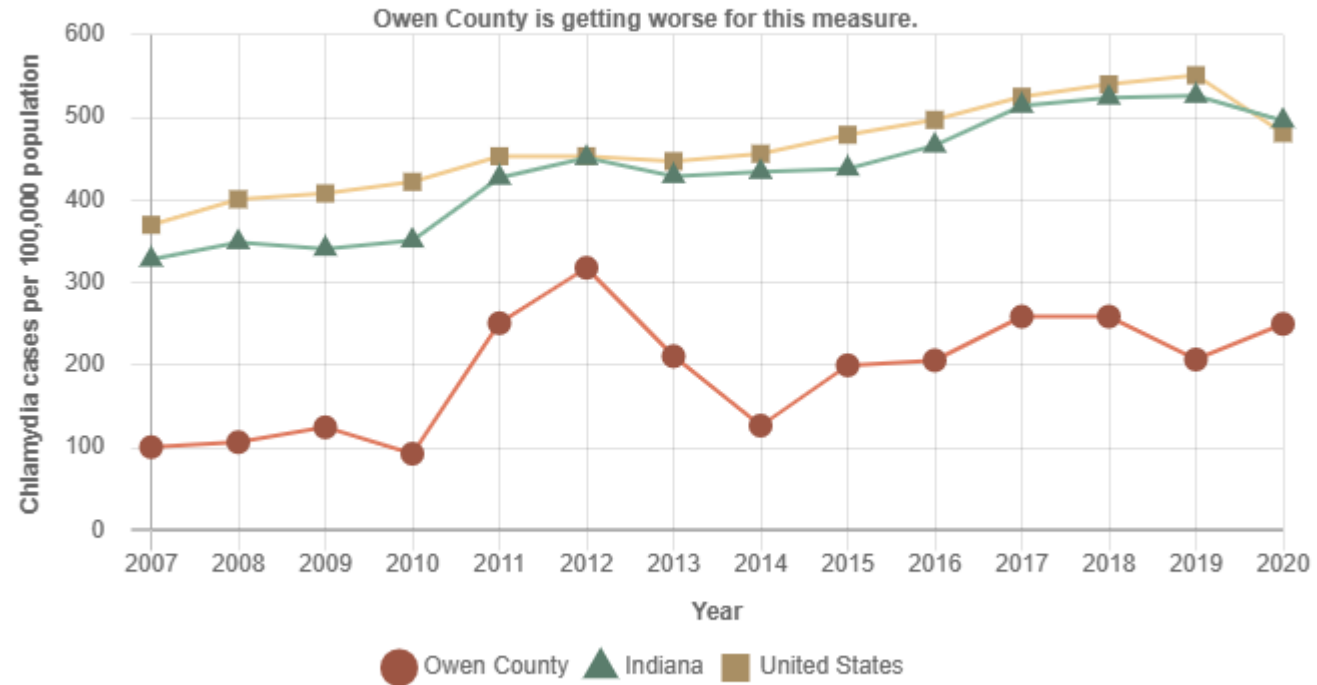
